What is the SFF: The SFF provides an international showcase for the Sicilian film industry, featuring Sicilian filmmakers, actors, and the best of its feature films, documentaries and shorts. SFF held its first festival in Miami in 2006; 2012 marks its seventh edition. The SFF is the first organization in the world to highlight the existence of a real "Sicilian cinema" and with it comes the international promotion of Sicily and Italy itself. Its success and its international credit derived from its continuity and variety of its events and are documented by large press and numerous citations and pages on the Internet. The name of the Sicilian Film Festival might suggest a local and regional folk festival designed to nostalgic immigrants. Instead SFF focuses on one of the most important Italian regions and on the immense Italian and international cinema that is transiting through Sicily and southern Italy; it is actually an elegant event directed to a cosmopolitan audience and is an international point of reference for a variety of operators around the world. The SFF was designed and created in 2006 by Emanuele Viscuso as the chairman. Its artistic director is Salvo Bitonti.

Dates: The dates of the next edition of the SFF will be held on April 11-17th, 2012. It will take place at the Miami Beach Cinematheque, in Miami Beach's Historic City Hall.

Delegations from other cities: Delegations from throughout the US and worldwide are welcome. Discounts at select hotels and restaurants available. VIP Cards for entry to all films, opening and closing parties and receptions throughout the festival can be purchased on the website. Delegation leaders will be interviewed and invited on stage.
